

We are honored to host our special quest, John Burger and his wife Mariangeles, for our Jubilee convention.

John is a Catholic reporter, journalist and now author of "At the Foot of the Cross: Lessons from Ukraine" which has been published in 3 languages.

He will be discussing insights from his interviews with His Beatitude Sviatoslav Shevchuk.

John began his career as a teacher of English, not only in the US, but also in China and France.

He then pursued a career in Catholic journalism as a reporter for Catholic New York, the newspaper of the Archdiocese of New York, in 1993, covering religious and civic news in and around the Big Apple and reporting from places as far afield as Albania.

He moved on to the National Catholic Register in 2001, where he was news editor, and since 2014 has been both news editor and reporter/writer for the Catholic website Aleteia.org. He also freelances for periodicals such as Columbia magazine, the monthly publication of the Knights of Columbus.

Growing up as a Roman Catholic in an Irish/German-American family, he was exposed to the Ukrainian Catholic tradition at an early age because of an older brother's marriage to a Ukrainian-American. Later in life, Burger felt drawn to the Byzantine liturgy and found himself attending Ruthenian and Ukrainian Greek Catholic churches more and more. As a Catholic journalist, he increasingly became attentive to news and feature stories concerning Eastern Christians and had opportunities to interview leading figures in the Eastern Christian world, including the patriarchs of the Maronite and Melkite Churches. An interview in Baltimore with His Beatitude Sviatoslav Shevchuk led to an invitation to write a book about him. In May 2019, he and his wife. Mariangeles, visited His Beatitude in Ukraine to interview him. Finally, Our Sunday Visitor accepted the manuscript of this book, just a month before the Februrary 2022 Russian invasion of Ukraine. At the Foot of the Cross: Lessons from Ukraine was published one year later.

Until his recent move to Georgia, John was a parishioner of St. Michael's Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church in New Haven, CT as well as a member of the Knights of Columbus, Metropolitan Andrey Sheptytsky Council 16253, also in New Haven, CT.

We are all looking forward to welcoming John and Mariangeles to our 90th Anniversary Convention.





The congress "Ukrainian Youth for Christ" (UYC) was dedicated to the 1900th anniversary of the Resurrection of Jesus Christ. It took place from May 5 to 7, 1933 in Lviv, when in Eastern Ukraine the hunger (Holodomor) was raging.

About 50,000 young men and women arrived in Lviv. Bishop Ivan Buchko accepted the youth's oath of loyalty to Christ. About 12,000 people took part in communion during the Holy Liturgy. Metropolitan Andrey Sheptytskyi blessed all the participants saying:

"Let this day be the beginning of a better, higher, more Christian, more Godly life!"

Metropolitan Andrey blesses us also on the 90th anniversary of the League of Ukrainian Catholics (LUC), which is a continuation of the League of Ukrainian Catholic Youth (UCYL), which began on August 19, 1933 in Chicago, Illinois.

LUC – Let Us Care!

"Ukrainian Youth for Christ" grows to the All-Church Patriarchal Youth Movement

In 2023, the UGCC youth organization Ukrainian Youth for Christ celebrates its 90th anniversary. On Sunday, July 23, during the Liturgy in the Church of St. Sophia, the Wisdom of God in Lviv, the Father and Head of the UGCC, His Beatitude Sviatoslav, announced that the UYC was granted patriarchal status.



Celebrations on the occasion of the 90th anniversary of the UGCC youth organization Ukrainian Youth for Christ began on the UCU campus in Lviv. His Beatitude Sviatoslav presided over the Hierarchical Divine Liturgy in the Church of St. Sophia, the Wisdom of God. He then solemnly announced the granting of patriarchal status to UYC while the youth took an oath of allegiance to Christ.



"This canonical order is a sign of respect, gratitude and patronage of our entire Church for you, dear young Ukrainians," His Beatitude Sviatoslav addressed the youth, "It is a sign of recognition of this movement, which has been maturing for 90 years to be officially called the patriarchal movement. I congratulate you on this day and ask you to bear with dignity the name of a Christian, which today you are solemnly renewing before the face of God."

Moreover, the Archbishop urged Ukrainian youth to renew their baptismal vows and those who are not yet members of UYC to join and become invincible by dedicating their lives to the Lord God: "Join us, no matter where you are: in Argentina, Brazil, Australia, Kazakhstan, Canada, or Zaporizhzhia. Become wise, invincible, and loving by dedicating your life to Christ."

As part of celebrating the 90th anniversary of UYC, His Beatitude Sviatoslav met with the youth, who belong to the Ukrainian Youth for Christ. Then at 6 PM, an evening prayer for the victory of Ukraine and Ukrainian youth defending their homeland began in the Metropolitan Gardens.

"The oath of allegiance to Christ means defeating the enemy who seeks to take our lives" — His Beatitude Sviatoslav at the UYC Congress

Today, every young Ukrainian and every Ukrainian woman must understand that in the face of this all-out war of Russia against Ukraine, the oath of allegiance to Christ means more than wisdom, knowledge, strength, and fortitude. It means victory over evil, our enemy who wants to take our lives. Today we want to feel that God's power, the ability to win, vibrates in the body of our people and our Church. His Beatitude Sviatoslav, the Father and Head of the UGCC, said this in his sermon during the Divine Liturgy on the 90th anniversary of the Ukrainian Youth for Christ movement.



Within the UYC Congress in Lviv, the Primate greeted the youth and recalled how, 90 years ago, the righteous Metropolitan Andrey Sheptytsky united Ukrainian youth who had devoted their lives to Christ, defying the human ideologies of the time.

"At a time when various human ideologies — Nazism, communism, chauvinism, even extreme nationalism, etc. — demanded that a young person swear an oath to give his life for that ideology, and called for the death of those who were enticed by it. The righteous Metropolitan Andrey Sheptytsky, gathered Ukrainian youth and showed them the only one to whom they should give their lives, devoting them to the Lord Jesus Christ, even to death. Our righteous metropolitan offered our youth to dedicate their lives not to some human ideology but to the Son of God," he emphasized.

Apart from that, His Beatitude Sviatoslav explained to the Ukrainian youth what it means to consecrate one's life to Christ and take an oath of allegiance to Him. According to the Primate, every time we seek truth and justice in the world, we seek Jesus Christ; every time we want to be wise, we seek Jesus Christ; every time we try to be real people, we seek Jesus Christ, because it was He who combined in His Divine Person both the fullness of the deity and the fullness of the human being.

Congratulating the youth of UYC, the Archbishop wished that this Christian youth movement would touch the hearts of girls and boys in our Church throughout the world.

Блаженніший Святослав у 90-річчя УМХ: Можете творити глобальну єдність нашої Церкви, бо ви тепер — Патріарша структура

23 липня молодіжна спільнота УГКЦ «Українська молодь — Христові» відзначила 90-річчя. З нагоди ювілейного з'їзду УМХ у Львові відбулися урочистості, які розпочалися Архиєрейською Божественною Літургією у храмі Святої Софії Премудрості Божої на території студмістечка УКУ, яку очолив Отець і Глава УГКЦ Блаженніший Святослав. До 90-ліття організації УМХ дістала статут Патріаршого рівня, який дає УМХ можливість стати глобальною молодіжною організацією Церкви.

Після Літургії Патріарх поспілкувався з молоддю. «Як нам бракує живих зустрічей,

щоб побути разом. Ніщо не замінить особистого живого спілкування, — підкреслив Блаженніший Святослав. — Хочу подякувати вам за те, що гуртуєтеся у спільноти — при ваших парафіях, у ваших містах і селах, що не сидите за закритими дверима по хатах, що виходите зі своєї приватної шкаралупи, щоб побачити іншу людину. Повірте, для сучасної людини робити це щораз, то тяжче. Дякую, що творите спільноти, щоб бути разом, разом радіти і сумувати».

«Коли збираємося разом, щоб підтримати одне одного, це дає нам можливість бути стійкими. Коли ми разом, ми маємо внутрішній імунітет проти страшних обставин: так, вакциною проти психічних травм війни є вміння переживати їх разом і переживати з Богом, у молитві. Тому коли ви разом і молитеся — ви маєте таку духовну вакцину, що ніщо не зможе вас залякати, ви тоді непереможні». — сказав архиєрей.

Глава УГКЦ підкреслив важливість таких спільнот, як УМХ, і для Церкви, і для всього суспільства: «Спільнота "Українська молодь — Христові" потрібна, найперше вам, бо робить вас сильнішими і здатними переживати тяжкі обставини. "Українська молодь — Христові" потрібна нашій Церкві, щоб Церква могла пригортати і зігрівати тих, кому сьогодні самотньо і боляче, хто не знає, як жити завтра. "Українська молодь — Христові" потрібна українському народові, який сьогодні шукає рятівного кола, щоб вистояти у таких непростих обставинах».

«Бути разом — бути спільнотою Церкви, де точно є присутній Ісус Христос, — це щось унікальне, — зауважив Предстоятель. — Якщо ми будемо так жити і боротися, ми обов'язково переможемо. Тому я абсолютно переконаний: українська християнська спільнота "Українська молодь — Христові" є дана Богом нашому народові і вам зараз як ключ до перемоги і виживання. Тому не занедбуйте це, цінуйте це, дружіть, любіть і підтримуйте одне одного. Вітаю спільноту із 90-річчям і запрошую: "Давайте будемо разом і будемо з Христом"».

Також Глава УГКЦ розповів зібранню про свою візію розвитку УМХ у найближчому часі і на майбутнє. Найперше, чого бажав би Блаженніший Святослав, — щоб осередки УМХ були в кожній парафії, щоб молодь мала свій простір, свій духовний дім. Друге побажання — щоб ці парафіяльні спільноти не замикалися

на собі, а зустрічалися, спілкувалися і таким чином творили ширший спільний простір міста, села, деканату, єпархії.

«УМХ унікальна тим, що до неї можуть належати всі, незалежно від віку: чи ти студент, чи учень, чи робітник, чи солдат, чи професор — ти можеш творити спільноту УМХ, — підкреслив Блаж. Святослав. — Тому збирайтеся, творіть ці ширші спільноти».

«І третє: сьогодні Церква подарувала спільноті "Українська молодь — Христові" окремий статут Патріаршого рівня. Що це означає? Що тепер для вас відкривається можливість мати живий контакт з вашими ровесниками у різних країнах світу, де є наша Цер-

ква. Серед вас точно є дівчата і хлопці, які розмовляють англійською, німецькою, іспанською. Будьте певні, що дівчата і хлопці в Канаді, в Америці, у Франції чи Аргентині, які, можливо, не знають української мови, хочуть із вами спілкуватися. І ви можете переступити через межі кордонів держав, через мовні бар'єри, і творити глобальну єдність нашої Церкви. Бо ви тепер — Патріарша структура, яка об'єднує молодих людей з цілого світу. Мені б дуже хотілося, щоб ця ініціатива не обмежувалася тільки Україною. Є так багато ваших ровесників, які чекають на можливість із вами познайомитися і потоваришувати. Творімо спільний молодіжний простір нашої Церкви в різних частинах земної кулі», — закликав Предстоятель.
